### Physical Education

Physical Education is compulsory for Years 8-10 and available at Years 11-12 and:

- Aims to encourage a healthy lifestyle through physical activity
- Encourages enjoyment and cooperation with others
- Includes a large range of sports/recreational activities
- At senior level, students can study this subject to meet SACE requirements.

### Co-curricular Program

- Marryatville High School offers an extensive range of both sporting and non-sporting activities
- Marryatville High School is a member of the Sports Association of Adelaide Schools (SAAS), the South Australian Catholic Secondary Schools Girls' Sports Association (SACSSGSA) and Secondary School Sport South Australia (SSSSA)

We encourage parent support and open communication through:

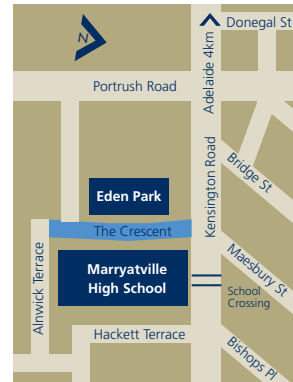
- Committees such as the Governing Council, the sub committees, Friends of Music, the Learning Assistance Program and Parents and Friends committee

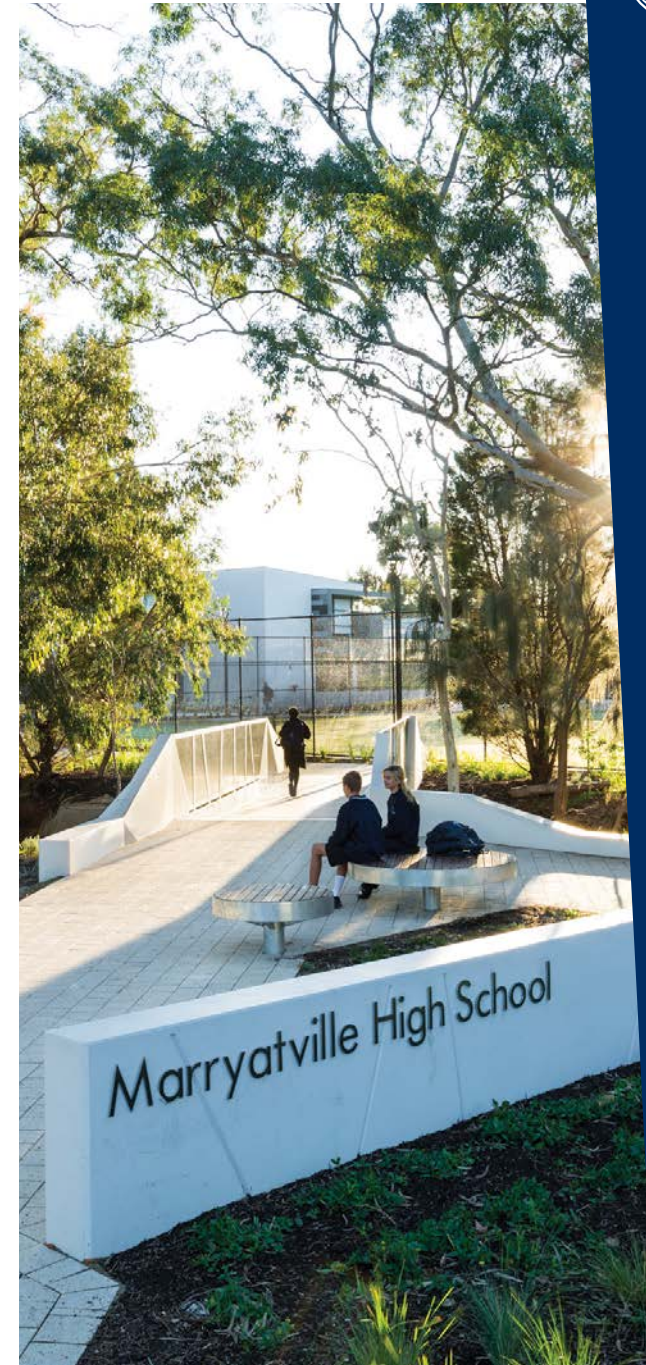

Marryatville High School has an enrolment of approximately 1350 students supported by 120 staff which allows us to offer a diverse curriculum and an extensive range of co-curricular activities available for students of all year levels.

In Years 8, 9 and 10 students follow the Australian Curriculum requirements while senior students are offered a wide range of subject choices in order to successfully complete their SACE.

All students are encouraged to strive for personal excellence in a positive learning environment that provides pathways to tertiary institutions and employment.

As an Internationally Accredited School, Marryatville High School offers a comprehensive International Program, with places highly valued by students from many countries around the world.

## Marryatville High School facilities include:

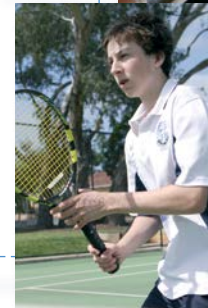
- Open Study Areas

## Challenging and Diverse Curriculum

Students have access to the following:

- **The Arts:** Music, Drama and Visual Arts
- **English:** Communications, English Studies, English as Alternative Language Dialect (EALD), ESL Studies
- **Health and Physical Education:** Health, Physical Education, Home Economics and Hospitality subjects
- **Languages:** Chinese, French, Japanese
- **Mathematics:** Pure and Applied subjects
- **Science:** Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology
- **Humanities and Social Studies (HaSS):** Business Studies, Geography, Classical Studies, History subjects
- **Technology:** Digital, Materials and Food
- **A Special Interest Music Program**
- **A Special Interest Tennis Program**
- **Vocational units and subjects**
- **A Co-curricular Program** featuring over 20 different activities with over 120 teams competing both within and outside of school hours.



## Transition Program

The transition program to support students moving from primary to secondary school includes:

- Extensive dialogue between primary schools and Marryatville High School
- Visits to the school in Term 4 by the Year 7 students
- Peer support from Year 11 students
- Orientation visits
- A Term 1 Induction program
- Parent information evenings.



## Special Interest Programs

### Special Interest Music

Marryatville High School has a Special Interest Music Program which is designed to cater for students with highly developed musical ability and music potential. This program includes:

- Extensive performance opportunities in South Australia, interstate and overseas
- A wide range of performance groups including Orchestras, Choirs, Jazz and Concert Bands and Chamber Music groups.

Students are selected by audition in May/June prior to the year of commencement. Entrance is competitive.

Students in Years 11 and 12 study Stages 1 and 2 of the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE). They select subjects from an extensive range of SSABSA approved courses.

### Special Interest Tennis

The Special Interest Tennis Program gives students:

- An opportunity to study and specialise in tennis with students of similar interests and abilities
- Support for academic studies
- Coaching at school with minimal disruption to study
- A Stage 1 SACE Unit at Year 10 level (Integrated Studies)
- Opportunities to further develop their skills
- Access to tournaments and competition.

Students for this specialist program must attain specified criteria prior to commencement of the school year.

### International Program

The International Program includes:

- Short term visits for students and teachers
- Study abroad for teachers and students
- Development of sister school relationships with schools in China, Japan and France
- Regular student tours to France and Japan
- A reciprocal student exchange program with sister schools in Japan.
- A biannual Drama Study exchange with a school in Singapore.
