Uniform Policy

Aim/Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to clearly outline the required Uniform at Marryatville High School and to define explicitly the responsibility of the members of the school community to ensure that this policy is adhered to.

Rationale

To show the acceptable Uniform at Marryatville High School.

Definition

In conjunction with Marryatville High School Governing Council, student Representatives and Senior Leadership staff, the school has a Uniform Policy in place that parents, teachers, and students are collectively responsible.

Responsibilities

Staff

Staff should discuss the uniform policy with their Homegroups (uniform menu and policy) Staff should remind students of acceptable Uniform when a student is out of uniform and complete a behavioural record in Daymap

Year Level Leaders should follow up on any student who is out of Uniform more than three times

Students

Students should make themselves aware of uniform policy
Students should follow uniform policy

Students should follow teacher instructions regarding Uniform requirements

Year Level Leaders, Counsellors, and School Leaders

Leaders should follow up on any uniform issues arising in their year level

Parents and Caregivers

Parents should purchase correct Uniform from the uniform shop Parents should monitor their children's uniform daily

Uniform Policy

All students are required to wear the uniform listed below and should be worn all year round. The only accepted uniform is Marryatville High School prescribed and is to be purchased though the UMS Retail Store, Glynburn Plaza Shop 12, 161-167 Glynburn Road, Firle.

Uniform Exemptions

The Marryatville High School Uniform policy has provisions for families to apply for a student exemption to allow students with specific needs to access alternative uniform items in exceptional circumstances.

Exemptions Categories

Families who believe that their student has a legitimate reason for an exemption under the following categories can apply to the relevant school leader who will seek an official exemption from the school Principal.

Exemptions can be granted for:

- monitoring or managing a medical condition e.g. alternative footwear for diabetic students
- a student disability e.g. severe sensory issues
- Cultural and/or religious beliefs e.g. leggings under school dress. Students can complete an
 exemption form for cultural/religious headwear if they wish. It is not a requirement to obtain
 an exemption.

Students who have been issued an exemption can only wear the item(s) that the exemption was granted for the period approved.

Exemptions, if approved, will be recorded on the Marryatville High School Learning Management System (DayMap) and a "Marryatville Exemption Card" will be issued to the student. This must be carried with them at all times and presented to staff on request.

Skirt	Marryatville High School design. Must be to be worn at a workplace
	appropriate length, no shorter than fingertips when arms are placed by sides.
Trouser	Plain dark navy school prescribed only, not rolled up.
Shorts	Navy shorts, school prescribed only
Stockings	Dark navy opaque style. Must be covering feet, NOT leggings (unless worn as
	part of cultural/religious beliefs)
Socks	Plain navy, black or white, without logos
Striped Polo S/S	Navy/sky/white striped with school logo, no rolled sleeves
Striped Polo L/S	Navy/sky/white striped with school logo
Striped Shirt	Long sleeve blue/white 2mm striped shirt
White Shirt	Long sleeve, short sleeve with school logo senior year 11/12 only, no rolled
	sleeves
Windcheater	Dark navy with school logo, school prescribed only
Jacket (thin)	Dark navy/sky blue with school logo
Puffer Jacket	Dark navy blue with school logo
Wool Jumper	Dark navy wool knit with school logo
Wool Vest	Dark navy wool knit vest with school logo
Rugby Top	Dark navy with sky/white stripe, school logo
Headwear	Navy bucket hat, broad brimmed or M cap (optional) (unless worn as part of
	cultural/religious beliefs)
Shoes	Plain black all leather enclosed shoes, no high heels, platforms, no canvas
	sneaker style. Boots are NOT acceptable.

PRESENTATION

Item Description

Nails	All nails must be an appropriate length to fully participate in required
	learning activities. This may vary depending on the requirements of specific subject areas.
Piercings	Minimalist approach. The size of the hardware must be acceptable for safe work practices.
Sporting Teams	Students representing the school in sport should wear the appropriate uniform. Team uniforms are available from the UMS Retail Store, Glynburn Plaza Shop 12, 161-167 Glynburn Road, Firle. Please check with the Co-Curricular Leader for clarification. Students should arrive at the venue in sports uniform.

HPE UNIFORM

PE uniform may be worn when travelling between school and home only if PE is the first or last scheduled lesson of the school day. Students MUST change during the day and cannot wear the PE uniform all day.

Shorts	Navy sports shorts school design with logo (ONLY to be work with PE
	uniform)
Shoes	Sports shoes/sneakers (no street or skate shoes)

MUSIC PERFORMANCE UNIFORM

Special Music students, senior music students and students in extra- curricular music ensembles are required to purchase the Music performance uniform.

Extra-curricular includes any ensemble outside normal school hours (after school and lunchtimes).

Elective Music students attending the Elder Hall Concert in term 4 who are not in any extracurricular ensembles, are NOT required to purchase the performance uniform.

Item Description

White Shirt	White long sleeved, business shirt (no logo)
Wool Vest	Dark navy wool knit vest with school logo
Trouser	Plain dark navy school prescribed only
School Tie	Navy blue with Skye/white stripe with logo
Shoes	Polished black leather lace up school shoes, no high heels, platforms, canvas sneaker style shoes or boots.
Socks	Long or short navy or black must cover the ankle bone, not to be worn over stockings.
Headwear	Worn as part of religious/cultural beliefs (plain navy)

GENERAL INFORMATION

Item Description

School Bag	Only prescribed navy-blue bag with school logo is acceptable. No logos, stickers, or graffiti are acceptable
Labelling	All school clothing should be clearly labelled with the student's name. This aids recovery if items are lost.
Scarf	A plain navy, or navy/white school scarf may be worn
Tour Groups	Tours groups may have additional uniform items to wear ONLY while on that tour



Marryatville High School Our Uniform

Only the following options are to be worn all year round.

No puffer jackets, quilted jackets, denim jackets etc.



Skirt, dress or shorts to be **no shorter** than fingertips when standing.





All black, enclosed leather shoes. No canvas or fabric shoes.

No branding on socks.



HPE Uniform

HPE uniform may be worn to school if HPE is the first lesson of the day, and worn home if last lesson of the day.

HPE uniform cannot be worn all day.












